



Two broad types of Leadership:

- Transactional Leadership
 - Essence Relating to others
 - Emphasis Engagement with others; communication, mutual influence
- Transformational Leadership
 - Essence Changing the world
 - Emphasis Change, improvement



IDENTIFYING SETTINGS/CONTEXT TO LEAD

- LEVEL/PHASE OF DEVELOPMENT OF GROUP (ORGANIZATION, COMMUNITY)
- GROUP COMPOSITION
- HISTORY
- PRIOR CONSEQUENCES
- "Historical forces create the circumstances in which people lead, but the characteristics of the particular leader in turn have their impact on history."

Identifying Strengths to Lead

- Leaders all have strengths and weaknesses
- Identify and maximize your strengths for leadership
- Leaders can change over time
 - Leadership needs and strengths may also change over time
- Develop and support Leadership Teams
 - Institutionalize leadership
 - Build teams to lead
