Alameda Success Story/Model Practice Award

The National Association of County and City Health Officials (NACCHO) selected Alameda County's *Cooking for Health Academy Curriculum* as a Model Practice Award Winner. Winning projects throughout the country are determined through a competitive, peer-reviewed process and, according to NACCHO's Chief Executive Officer Lori Tremmel Freeman, "showcase of the best and brightest in local public health."¹

Cooking for Health Academy classes teach adults healthy eating and nutrition while incorporating hands-on healthy cooking. As a bonus, the curriculum prepares adult participants to take the safe food handlers' exam to enhance job skills and marketability aligning with two SNAP priorities."² Alameda Cal Fresh Healthy Living staff assisted interested students to take the certification exam.

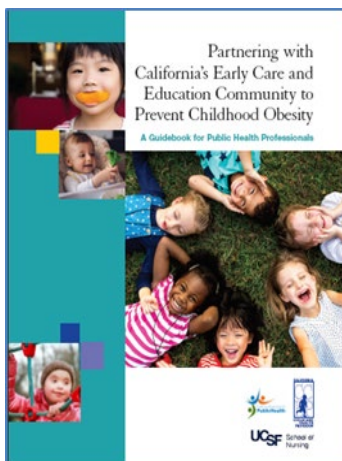

ECE Guidebook for Public Health Professionals Available on the Web StoreFront



The *Partnering with California's Early Care and Education Community to Prevent Childhood Obesity Guidebook (ECE Guidebook)* provides an overview of California's Early Care Education (ECE) environment that can help guide public health professionals in engaging with ECE partners. Specifically, the *ECE Guidebook* assists public health professionals such as health educators, registered dietitians, nurses, and others in understanding ECE in California. It provides information about the ECE landscape, funding, laws, best practices, advocacy, and quality improvement. It builds on existing strategies to reduce childhood obesity and provides ideas for collaboration. The guidebook was developed by the University of California, San Francisco School of Nursing's California Childcare Health Program; and was funded in part by the United States Department of Agriculture through the California Department of Public Health.

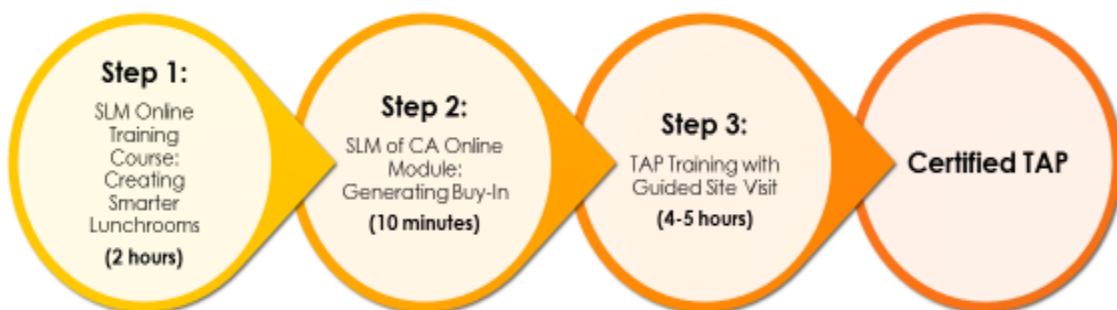
SLM in California- What's an LHD to do?
